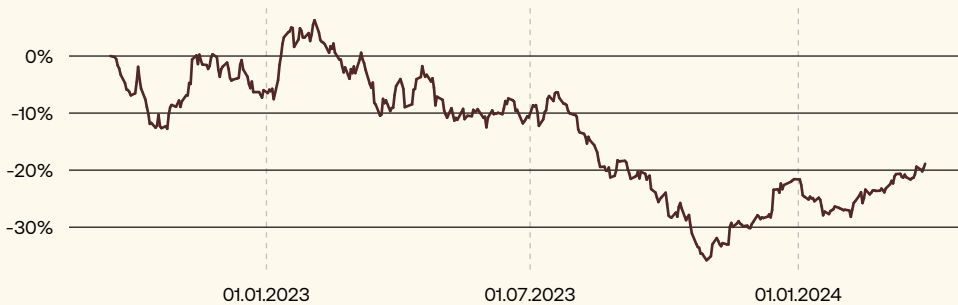

The sub-fund "Thematica – Renewable Future" seeks capital growth by investing mainly in companies that are focused or will substantially benefit from the energy transition. Areas include but are not limited to, renewable energy, energy efficiency, waste management and other smart technologies that aim to decarbonize industries essential to reach climate targets. The sub-fund is actively managed. The composition of the portfolio is established, regularly reviewed and adjusted where appropriate by the Fund Manager solely in accordance with the criteria set in the investment objectives / investment policy. The sub-fund is not managed using an index as a benchmark.

GLOSSARY

Sharpe Ratio: A reward of a portfolio's excess return relative to the total variability of the portfolio.

Volatility: The relative rate at which the price of a security moves up and down, found by calculating the annualized standard deviation of daily change in price.

R2: A statistical measure that represent the percentage of a fund or security's movements that can be explained by movements in a benchmark index.

Beta: A measure of the volatility, or systematic risk, of a security or a portfolio in comparison to the market as a whole.

Jensens Alpha: A risk-adjusted performance measure that represents the average return on a portfolio over and above that predicted by the capital asset pricing model (CAPM), given the portfolio's beta and the average market return.

Monthly commentary

Comment

Sentiment across the renewable energy ecosystem is improving despite the high-interest-rate environment. However, we notice that Thematica – Renewable Future A USD, up 3.43% in q1 2024, is significantly outperforming iShares – Global Clean Energy ETF (which tracks the widely used industry benchmark S&P Global Clean Energy Index), which is down 10.21% during the same period. While sentiment is on the rise, it has been crucial to avoid certain underperforming subsectors, notably the solar sector, where we have limited exposure. Instead, we've been capitalizing on opportunities in the grid equipment sector. Our grid equipment companies, such as HD Hyundai Electric, LS Electric, and Hyosung Heavy Industries, have demonstrated strong performance, offering robust growth potential coupled with more attractive valuations compared to European and US peers. These companies are benefiting from grid modernization initiatives in the US. The United States is grappling with a significant challenge in meeting the increasing demand for transformers, essential devices on the power grid. Distribution transformers play a pivotal role in managing electricity flow along the grid, like traffic controllers regulating vehicle flow on roads. Given that nearly every kilowatt-hour of electricity passes through them, their significance cannot be overstated.

On the macro side, we await clearer signals of interest rate cuts, which would provide a significant boost to our smaller companies affected by the current interest rate climate. The entire renewable energy sector has been negatively impacted by the high-interest-rate environment, given its capital-intensive nature, and the consumer-driven side of the spectrum has waned.

The US market has exhibited resilient growth, but the possibility of three rate cuts, as per the consensus, remains uncertain. Powell, however, mentioned that even if the most recent inflation figures were higher than expected, they did not materially alter the overall picture. He further highlighted that it would likely be appropriate to begin lowering rates "at some point this year," and "on inflation, it is too soon to say whether the recent readings represent more than just a bump." We are also cautious regarding the strength of the labor market. We observe a rise in individuals working multiple jobs, potentially indicative of inflationary pressures as people seek to counter rising costs by increasing their work hours. This is not really a sign of a strong labor market but rather a desperate one.

We are witnessing signs of stabilization in China, particularly in the manufacturing sector, which has shown signs of revival as factory activity expanded for the first time in six months. March's PMI rose to 50.8 from February's 49.1, indicating a shift towards growth. Furthermore, the heavy outflows from Chinese equity markets observed last year are now stabilizing, prompting investor interest in "cheap" Chinese stocks, as highlighted by Ray Dalio, amidst Beijing's efforts to revitalize the economy. We see opportunities in Chinese renewable energy companies that have been hard-hit over the last two years.

Overall, we are beginning to see signs of recovery in the renewable energy sector and anticipate a rotation into the sector from other overvalued sectors. As a sector expected to benefit from lower interest rates, it's time to get excited about the opportunities ahead, especially as governments worldwide pivot towards lower interest rates.

RISKS

Market risk: The assets in which the Management Company invests for the account of the subfund(s) are associated with risks as well as opportunities for growth in value. Sustainability risk: Sustainability risk is defined as the materialization of an environmental, social or governance (hereinafter "ESG") event or condition which could have a material adverse effect – whether actual or potential – on the value of the investment and therefore on the performance of the subfund. Sustainability risks can have a significant impact on other types of risk, such as market price risks or counterparty default risks, and can substantially influence the risk within these risk types. Failure to take ESG risks into account could have a negative impact on returns in the long term. It should be noted that the subfund's objective is not sustainable investment and the underlying investments in this subfund have no binding obligation to consider EU criteria for environmentally sustainable economic activities as set out in Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 and in Regulation (EU) 2020/852.
